In 2006, the entire BDCH team of over 1,000 employees made a public commitment to Excellence. Delivered. We made this pledge to

the thousands of people who entrust BDCH with the care of their parents, spouses and children, and their friends, whether in the clinic, in the hospital, in surgery, at home, or for child care. Since this journey began five years ago, tremendous and continuous progress has been made. In this last year our efforts have begun to be recognized nationally, *and for this I commend our employees*. I'd like to share just some of their achievements.

Our continued improvement in the Emergency Department kept us *in the top 10 percent* for patient satisfaction throughout 2010 and 2011 and caught the attention of Studer Group, which awarded the BDCH Emergency Department with a 2011 *Excellence in Patient Care* award.

The BDCH Oncology Department was also honored with a prestigious Studer Group *Excellence in Patient Care* award this year and is rated *in the top 7 percent nationally*.

BDCH Hillside Home Care & Hospice's service to the community continues to shine, receiving the Home Care Elite Award for the *fifth consecutive year*, and we have had great success meeting our clinical quality goals.

BDCH has also received the HealthGrades® Outstanding Patient Experience Award for the *3rd consecutive year*. This award places BDCH *in the top 10 percent nationally* for quality and patient satisfaction. Attaining these high standards requires ongoing dedication from the people who provide care every day.

BDCH Medical Staff physicians have for decades provided access to care in many communities across our service area. In the last year BDCH has built upon this with the addition of regional medical clinics that provide Family Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and Sports Medicine in the region. Our partnership this year with Milwaukee Radiologists, LTD. brings advanced subspecialty radiology to our patients, close to home.

In the coming year, we will continue to expand our services to better meet the health care needs of patients across the region. We plan to strengthen our community roots, reaching out to our region's citizens through community forums, helping us better understand what is needed now and in the future.

We will reaffirm our commitment to improving quality and service. We will provide our advanced clinical staff with newer technology, including state-of-the art MRI, the latest in breast health diagnostics and a new information technology platform. Already, BDCH has introduced world-class University of Wisconsin stroke care to the region with the implementation of the Telestroke program.

Looking ahead, BDCH will be carefully examining the economic and political factors which not only affect the landscape of health care, but the citizens of our region.

Many are still affected by the downturn in the global economy. Members of our community are unemployed, uninsured or underinsured. Health care reform, meanwhile, presents a series of new challenges for health care systems around the country. While the future holds many unknowns, one constant is our commitment to strengthening our services, continuing quality improvement and increasing access to care locally.



Beaver Dam Community Hospital has teamed up with Milwaukee Radiologists to provide patients with the best diagnostic and interventional radiology services in the region. Milwaukee Radiologists, LTD is a premiere subspecialized radiology group featuring 35 board-certified radiologists.

Using teleradiology to consult with offsite subspecialty radiologists, BDCH patients have access to the most advanced medical imaging interpretations in their own community. In addition, onsite specialized radiologists offer personalized care for digital mammography, ultrasounds and interventional radiology.

"Teleradiology has made it possible for Beaver Dam Community Hospital to function as well as a tertiary care center because you have the same subspecialty radiologists providing expert imaging interpretation," said Dr. Mark Wenzel, Medical Director of Imaging at BDCH. "That's a big advantage. Teleradiology is the wave of the future, and it has already arrived at Beaver Dam Community Hospital."

World-Class Stroke Care Made Available to Local Patients

Patients coming to Beaver Dam Community Hospital's Emergency Department now have a powerful tool against stroke's devastating effects with immediate access to world-class stroke neurologists at the UW Comprehensive Stroke Center in Madison.

BDCH is part of the UW Telestroke Network, which offers quick assessment and response to the medical emergency of stroke. This swift response is critically beneficial to our patients since time is of the essence with stroke, as brain cells are lost at the rate of 1.9 million neurons per minute as a stroke cuts off blood flow.

Comprehensive and Compassionate Breast Health Care



When it comes to Women's Health, Beaver Dam Community Hospital is the areas leader and is dedicated to providing women with the most advanced and compassionate care that is available. BDCH was the first hospital in the region to offer Digital Mammography for immediate image availability and greater patient comfort. BDCH is also proud to provide the only Mammotome® Biopsy System for minimally invasive biopsy, with reduced scarring and often no need for stitches. Over the past year our breast health nurses have received advanced training in order to become certified Cancer Navigators. BDCH will also be adding stereotactic biopsy this year.

Image-Guided Surgery the New Standard

Even the safest and most effective sinus surgery can be challenging when disease, previous surgery or anatomical variations create obstacles.

That's why image-guided surgery has become the standard for endoscopic sinus surgeries. At Beaver Dam Community Hospital, the innovative Fusion ENT Navigation System offers the maximum amount of information about each patient's unique anatomy, ensuring reliable accuracy and positive outcomes.

The Fusion ENT Navigation System is the first and only electromagnetic ENT system with reproducible accuracy, another ENT innovation that has been improving outcomes for patients suffering from chronic sinusitis.

Sleep Medicine Diagnoses, Treats Disorders

Sleep disorders can seriously interfere with emotional and physical health, often leading to depression, reduced concentration and impaired memory and judgment.

BDCH is now equipped with the latest technology, allowing our trained professionals to diagnose and treat sleep disorders. BDCH's newly installed sleep lab system offers state-of-the-art technology and allows for advanced sleep studies to be performed.



The BDCH Medical Clinics add a great health care asset to the region, offering convenient access to high-quality physicians who practice Family Medicine, Obstetrics and Gynecology, and Primary Care Sports Medicine.

With same-day appointments guaranteed for Family Medicine, and Walk-In Care available in Columbus and Waupun, BDCH has significantly increased the ease of access for our patients. Care is also more versatile, offering high-level care for those needing immediate assistance as well as highly recommended primary care physicians to meet needs today, tomorrow and into the future.

In our first year, BDCH Medical Clinics registered 10,000 patient encounters and demonstrated scores in the 95th percentile for Overall Quality of Care and the 99th percentile in Patient Recommendations.

With locations in Beaver Dam and Mayville, FastCare allows patients to walk in without an appointment. Patients can be treated for minor ailments including earaches, sinus and upper respiratory infections, cold and flu symptoms, mononucleosis, insect bites, minor burns, rashes and poison ivy.

HealthWORKS provides local employees the resources they need to lead healthy, productive lives and also enables companies to maintain safe working environments.



Financial Performance


